As we step into the future, let's continue to nurture the unity, pride, and friendships that make VIT an extraordinary place to learn, grow, and celebrate. Together, we thrive!





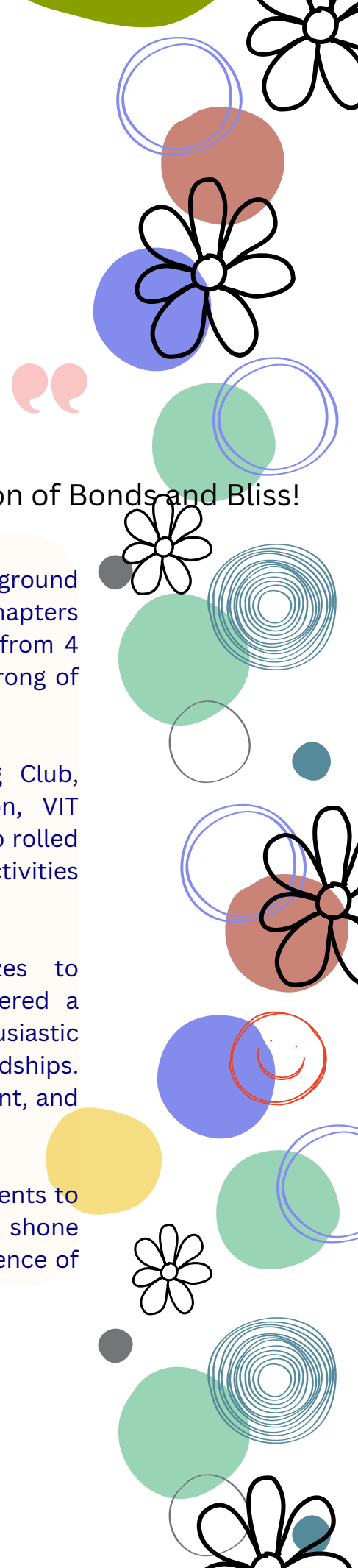
## VIT Vellore's Friendship Day Extravaganza: A Celebration of Bonds and Bliss!

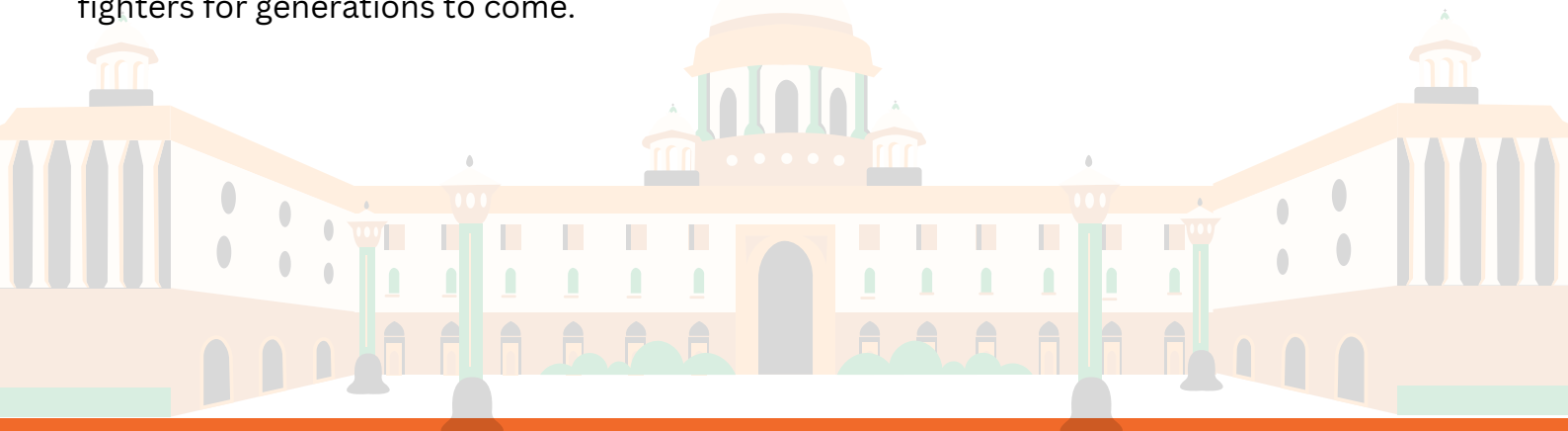

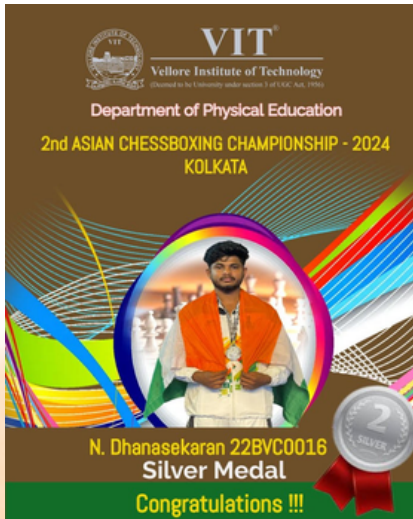

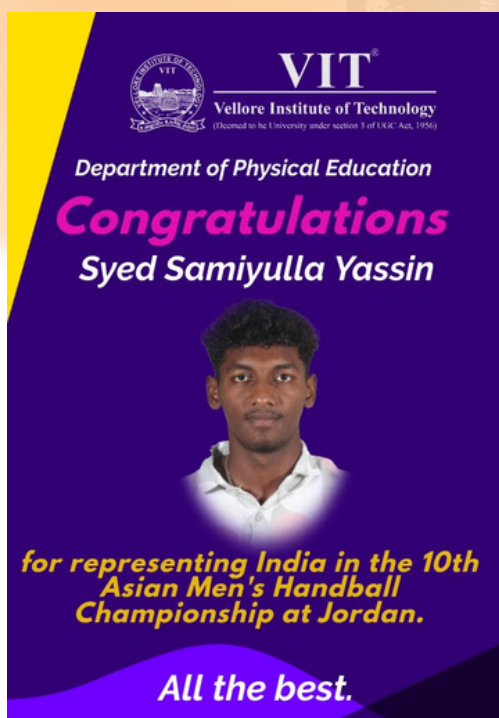

This revolutionary technology enables precise DNA alterations in fertilized eggs, opening up new paths for genetic illness research. Researchers can examine the fundamental causes of illnesses such as autism and Alzheimer's disease by modifying specific chromosome regions, perhaps leading to revolutionary discoveries and therapy advancements.

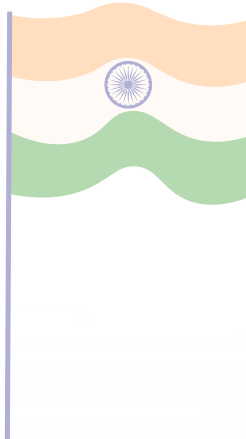
