Overall, August 2025 stood as a month of national pride, celebration, achievement, and service, reflecting the strong values of the VIT community.

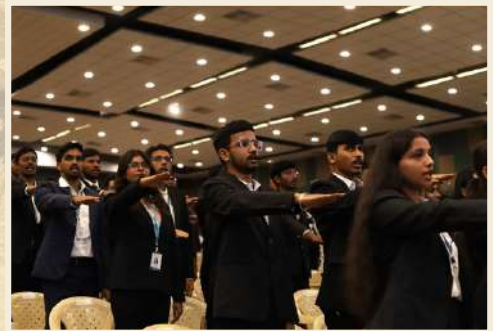

OpenAI: GPT 5 -reasoning Model Released.

The latest model that has been revealed by OpenAI is GPT -5, which, according to the researchers, reaches Level 2 level of reasoning. In contrast to antecedent iterations, GPT-5 includes an internal pause system that allows time to reflect before writing down an answer and, therefore, solves complicated mathematical proofs and logical puzzles previously inaccessible to preceding models, and so provides further incentive in the direction toward artificial general intelligence (AGI).

Climate: The White Sky Experiment.

Controversy A small-scale aerosol cloud of calcium carbonate particles in the stratosphere was released in a controversial engineering effort to boost solar reflectance called geo-engineering. The experiment though on a small scale was able to achieve success by reducing the local atmosphere temperatures by 0.5 o C thus sparking heated debate across the world with regard to the possibility of mankind interfering with the thermoregulation of the planet artificially.

It is the Space: Private Station haven-1 Modules Launch.

The first module of the commercial space station Haven-1 in the world is initiated by the private sector. The Falcon 9 launch was a successful launch of the solar arrays on the module and the facility is already waiting to launch its first group of private astronauts signaling the beginning of a post-International Space Station phase with space tourism and research.

Gaming: The BrainComputer Interface Controller.

A non-invasive neural headset used to play games has been showed by Valve and Neuralink. The device derives the motor cortex signals with the skull and lets the user execute a very simple action within the game like reloading a gun or casting spells but only by deliberately thinking so that reaction times would be within several milliseconds.

Farming: Vertical Farming Reinvented.

Dubai has just opened the largest vertical farm in the world that is producing 3,000 tons of leafy greens per year with 95 percent less water use that is required in traditional farming. The autonomous plant will have AI to survey every leaf to identify the shortage of nutrients, thus enhancing food security within the desert area.
