Dr. Rambabu Kodali, Vice Chancellor and Chairperson IQAC, welcomed all the IQAC members. He highlighted the following activities held during this academic year:

- Annual convocation conducted at Vellore and Chennai campuses and the number of graduands.
- Admission of UG and PG students during this academic year and induction program conducted for them.
- Placement offers arranged through campus interviews for the outgoing batch – 934 companies with 13462 offers.
- Ranking – Improvement in ranking positions, namely Shangai WUR, and NIRF rankings
- Revised curriculum finalized for the admitted students
- Emphasised the role of IQAC in enhancing the quality in all aspects

Dr. Narayanan, Pro Vice Chancellor, Vellore campus, thanked all the members for joining the meeting. He highlighted some of the activities currently being carried out, in addition to that addressed by VC:

- Honorary doctorate conferred upon Dr. Sethuraman (Mention his credentials) during the 37th annual convocation held at Vellore campus.
- Highest salary among the offers through placement drive was more than 1 Crore Per annum
- VIT has organised a programme for college Principals under “Naan Mudhalvan” scheme rolled out by The govt. of Tamil Nadu .

Dr. V.S. Kanchan Bhaaskaran, Pro Vice Chancellor, Chennai campus, welcomed all the members. She highlighted some of the functional points in her address as given below:

- The result analysis showed that the outgoing students’ pass percentage is very good (95%) but the pass % is less in first and second years for B.Tech Programmes.
- The students must use the hardware labs increasingly for experiential learning
- At Chennai campus, Industry 4.0 lab would be introduced soon.
- Some observations on the exams conducted during offline mode were highlighted.

6.i Strengthening Teaching-Learning Process: Transition from online to offline mode:

Discussion:

Student members mentioned that,

- They are not able to cope up with offline mode due to several issues in transition from online to offline mode, and they requested hybrid mode for at least few courses.
- Interaction with senior students to be facilitated.
- QCM meeting may be arranged with professors who are not handling classes for them.
- Students are finding it difficult to write FAT on consecutive days and they requested on alternate days.
- Wi-Fi facility to be upgraded in hostel premises for better connectivity.
- In library, students can be allowed to use the discussion rooms
- Movement across blocks in between the successive classes is very difficult within change over time (10 minutes).
- Need effective mentor-mentee system

Dean Academics, Vellore Campus, answered the students:

- Students will be able to cope-up shortly and is a matter of time
- Some negative emotions may be wiped by effective counseling
- Thon events may be organized to engage the students
- Course registrations may be planned properly to avoid exams on consecutive days.

ProVC (Vellore) said that "GraVITas" can be utilized for good interaction with seniors.

Dr. G. L. Samuel, IIT Madras congratulated for improvement in international and national rankings. He also appreciated the IQAC for getting the approval for AICTE Distinguished Chair Professor Scheme.

Mr. Elavarasu Krishnan, DELL, appreciated the action taken reports for the suggestions given in the earlier meetings.

- He mentioned on "Train our Engineers" to handle real world problems.

Mrs. Muthazhagi, Alumni member congratulated VIT for improvement in national and international rankings.

- Teaching in hybrid mode for some of the courses shall be explored.
- Micro learning helps learners to master a session
- The students must be encouraged towards social learning

Mr. Elavarasu Krishnan, DELL, suggested utilizing alumni network to bring in corporate people, which would strengthen the interaction.

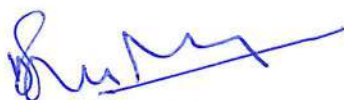
Mrs. Muthazhagi, Alumni member suggested the following.

She enlightened the objective of this meeting is to enhance the quality of academic and administrative performance of the existing system and processes.

Dr. Rambabu Kodali, Vice Chancellor and Chairperson IQAC, welcomed all the IQAC members and requested to focus on the discussion points. He insisted that good ecosystem is required to excel in research.

- To strengthen the research environment in the institute, we should focus on academic research, sponsored research, research centres, industrial consultancy, institute innovation council, startups, and so on.
- To create a good environment for research, increase the collaboration and partnership between industry, government and institute at local, national and international level.
- Mobilize the research resources and enhance the functions.
- Teaching learning process and Research & Development are the two pillars to produce academic excellence. He requested the IQAC members to provide suggestions in these two areas to enhance research in VIT.

Dr. Partha Sharathi Mallick, Pro Vice Chancellor of Vellore campus welcomed the members and briefed VIT's journey in research and development in last 10 years.

- VIT's has been successful in publishing the highest number of Scopus indexed papers in India since 2018. The quality of research is prominent in terms of number of papers, h-index, and citations.
- As per NIRF 2022 ranking, in perception VIT is 7th in the country next to established IITs and IISc.

- He insisted the significance of multidisciplinary research, massive international collaboration in terms of publication, UG research, IP and commercialization, etc. to enhance research ecosystem.

3. India Rankings 2023

Dr. Murugan, Director – Directorate of Ranking, presented VIT's position in India and world ranking:

- NIRF ranking status of VIT showed an improvement in Overall, Engineering and University

category.

- For analysis purpose, metric level analysis in overall category of NIRF ranking was presented normalizing to that of student strength.
- Research and Professional Practice was good and was identified as third in India level.
- With regard to citation in Q1 journal, VIT is very good and is No. 1 in India.
- The graduation outcome is good with respect to exam results. However, the number of PhD graduates must be improved.
- Regarding Outreach and inclusivity, the number of students admitted under STARS, physically challenged category may be improved.
- With regard to Perception, VIT is in 3rd position under University category.
- The strength and the scope for improvement was presented – FSR, number of programs, MDP/EDP are to be improved. Development of NPTEL/ SWAYAM courses must be initiated by collaborating with Government Institutions. Patents and student support & progression must also be improved.

He congratulated on the improvement in NIRF ranking. The following suggestions were given for improvement:

- Mission can be relooked if necessary fine-tuned to reach the excellence.
- International exposure to the faculty members is very important.
- VIT can devise some schemes to attract faculty members from top 500 ranked institutions.
- Post docs from foreign universities can be hired for faculty positions
- Air conditioned classrooms with the help of green energy can be planned in a phased manner.

Mrs. Muthazhagi, Alumni member suggested the following points:

- She congratulated the VIT for VIT-B venture and also appreciated the hospitality rendered by the IQAC team during her tenure.
- The rest rooms in the academic and hostel blocks can be maintained well.
- Admission, students' welfare and alumni office should support the students in all aspects.
- For Higher studies, a separate center can be established to motivate and train the interested students.
- Alumni chapters of VITAA shall be tracked for the support it provided to the students.

- Conduct of school wise Alumni day.
- Innovation should be showcased to motivate students through rewards or leadership programs.
- Personality development program shall start from day-1 of the students joining the VIT.

Mrs. Devi, Parent member insisted that

- The procedures for leave application of students in case of emergency shall be liberal.
- There shall be a gap between the last instructional day and final assessment test to enable the students to prepare well for the examination.
- The FAT schedule shall be available to the students during the course registration itself.

Mr. Ganesh Thirunavukarasu, Regional Head – Academic interface Programme, TCS, Chennai appreciated the ranking achievements of VIT.

Mr. Elavarasu Krishnan, Vice President – Product Development, DELL Technologies, Bangalore suggested that continuous improvement is necessary. The patenting of research works shall be encouraged.

Dr. J. N. Swathi, Teacher Representative suggested that the marks for *additional learning* shall be re-introduced for the benefit of some students.

Dr. Sathianarayanan, Teacher Representative appreciated the open access charges given to the faculty members for publishing in Q1 and Q2 journals. However, some journals are not included. If they are added before December, it would be helpful.

- Seed grant for students may be provided
- Long term strategy for continuous improvement is needed
- Operational expenses should be improved.
