4.<u>(I) ELIGIBILITY</u>

- Any graduation with 60% marks (Inclusive of all subjects) from a Recognised University or Institution with a minimum of three years duration.
- Performance in Group Discussions and Face to Face Interview.
- In case of applicants belonging to SC/ST community or applicants hailing from Jammu and Kashmir/ Ladakh and the North Eastern States of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura, **10% relaxation is provided** as per the condition, in the qualifying examination mentioned above.
- Applicants hailing from Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh and the North Eastern states of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. They should submit Nativity Certificate Applicants from Correspondence / Open University mode are not eligible

5.ONLINE APPLICATION

- The applicants should apply online in the respective link provided in the website (www.vit.ac.in) by paying a non-refundable application fee of Rs.600/- (Rupees six hundred only)
- The applicants should also have their scanned copy of all documents with photo and signature ready to upload.
- Not eligible and in-complete applications shall not be considered and NO correspondence shall be made in this regard.
- The Admission will be on the basis of the performance in the qualifying examination U.G. Degree.

6. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- The Admission will be on the basis of the performance in the qualifying examination U.G. (or its equivalent)
- Candidates will be called for the Personal Interview in the order of merit based on the U.G. marks.
- The fact that a candidate has qualified and has been called for the Personal Interview does not guarantee admission to him / her. This depends upon the cut-off fixed on the merit list and the availability of seats.
- The selected candidates list / result will be published on VIT website.

- The candidates should produce statement of final year marks and provisional degree certificate **before 15th August, 2024** failing which admission will be cancelled with the forfeit of admission fee.

8. <u>GENERAL DISCIPLINE</u>

All Applicants admitted to the institute shall maintain good conduct, pay the requisite tuition fees and other charges by the due dates, attend their classes regularly and abide by the rules and regulations of the Institute.

If at any point of time, if the conduct and character of an applicant is not satisfactory or is of suspicious nature, the Management reserves the right, without assigning any reason, to make him / her vacate the hostel or expel him / her from the Institute.

8.1 Measures for prevention of ragging at the Institute level:

- Ragging is totally prohibited in the institution and anyone found guilty of ragging and / or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the regulations as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.
