SHORT SYLLABUS**XXXX Social Work 3 Credits**

Social work is a practice-based profession that concerns itself with individuals, families, groups, communities and society as a whole in an effort to meet the basic needs and enhance social functioning, self-determination, collective responsibility and overall well-being. Introduction to society's response to social need through a generalist approach to family services, child welfare, physical and mental health services, school related services, corrections, gerontology and populations-at-risk.

XXXX Social Work Practice with Individuals 3 Credits

This course focuses on the transactional relationships between people and their social environments. The skill development, specifically engaging the client, interviewing proficiency and critical thinking related to assessment processes and problem identification. The course enables one to understand the importance of developing relationships with clients, colleagues, professionals and other organizations.

XXXX Social Work Practice with Groups 3 Credits

This course explains the concepts of group and its dynamics and the theory developed globally to explain different facets of functioning of groups. The major events in a group and provides a rationale of formulating based on group work practice. This course emerges as a central strategy in formulating development programmes and application of group work to facilitate the work with individuals.

XXXX Social Work Practice with Community 3 Credits

Social work practice is conceived as helping individuals facing problems of social functioning or interventions designed to work with communities both urban and rural to promote development. This course insists that the attention is based on community issues and not self-centred. This course helps to understand in identifying the needs and resources of the community.

XXXX Psychology 3 Credits

Modern approaches of psychology, Sensation, Perception, Learning, Motivation, Intelligence, Emotion, Personality, Childhood years, Adolescence, Adulthood, Aging, Social Thought, Social Behaviour and Abnormal Psychology.

XXXX Sociology 3 Credits

The importance of Sociology for Social Work Practice, Society and Culture, Social Structure and Functioning, Social Mobility, Social Disorganization and Social Problems, Structural Analysis of Social Problems, Developmental Issues, Contemporary issues.

XXXX Field work I 6 Credit

Observation visits - workshop - concurrent fieldwork - social work trainees reach out to the individuals/families, groups and community through the different institutions.

XXXX Social Policy and Planning 3 Credits

Social Policy & Planning, Social legislations and Social Justice, Models of Policy, Policy Formulation, Economic and Social Development, Major policies and Programmes, Policy Implementation and Stakeholders, Contemporary issues.

XXXX Community Organisation and Development 3 Credits

Historical perspective of Community Organization, Social goals in Community Development, Community Living Models, Models & Approaches of Community Organization Practice, The Process of Community Organization & Participatory Rural Appraisal, Community Mobilization, Relationship of Social Action with Social Problems, Social Movement, Social Reform, Social Development, Social Justice and Distributive Justice, Social Legislation and Social Conflict.

XXXX Social Welfare Administration 3 Credits

Social welfare administration provides understanding on the administrative services of a social welfare organisation with their functions and policies, planning, execution, organisation structure, leadership and supervision. This course provides an understanding on various concepts such as social welfare administration, social policy, social planning, social security, social legislation.

XXXX Principles and Practice of Counselling 3 Credits

Foundations of Counselling, Rapport and Relationship Skills, Assessing client problems and developing counselling goals, Counselling Intervention Strategies, Termination and follow-up, Professional Preparation and Counselling in different settings.

XXXX Social Legislation 3 Credits

Social Legislation, Laws related to Citizens, Marriage and Law, Women and Law, Children and Law, Social Problems and Law, Laws Related to Workers & Differently Abled Groups, Contemporary issues.

XXXX Research Methodology 4 Credits

Research methodology is a technique to identify, apply, analyse, a specific topic for study. The various concepts, importance of research project, methods of social research, research questions, research design, quantitative and qualitative research methods, different measurement and scaling techniques, tools of data collection, sources of data collection, sampling techniques, data analysis and interpretation, statistical test, parametric tests of hypotheses, important parametric and non-parametric tests, will be discussed in detail.

XXXX Field work II 6 Credits

Concurrent field work in local Self-government institutions, welfare agencies, development organizations, the criminal justice systems, civil administration centres, hospital settings, NGOs, rural/tribal camps and so on.

XXXX Summer Internship 2 Credits

Placed in an institution for a summer internship (non-supervised) for one month to expand their research horizons through practitioner experience to add value to their upcoming research projects.
