Concept Note of Seminar

Sardar Patel's contribution to tackle the improbable challenges that India faced and his imagination for nation-building is a living embodiment of his pragmatic thought for the cultural, political and economic preservation of the nation. Consequently, he alerted people to be mindful of the fact that independence will eventually bring in the form of responsibility, pragmatic policy-making and ensuing task for nation-building. The Indian independence movement is incomplete without recognizing the monumental contributions of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, often referred to as the "Iron Man of India". Sardar Patel as a popular farmer leader, an organiser in the organisation, and later as Home Minister and the Deputy Prime Minister left no stone unturned to mobilise, sensitise and organise people for the cause of Bharat's freedom from the British rule, cultural imperialism and colonisation of the mind and thought.

As the nation transitioned into independence amidst unprecedented challenges, Patel emerged as a stalwart leader whose pragmatic vision and decisive actions laid the foundation for India's unity and integrity. Practical to the core, he possessed sharp common sense and an exceptional understanding of people and situations, making him a remarkable leader with an unyielding grasp of reality and human nature. Within a short span of time, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel reshaped the political map of India by ensuring the seamless integration of over 556 princely states into the Indian nation. His pragmatic approach and strategic vision of foreign policy and national security transformed a fragmented political landscape into a unified nation, complementing cultural unity and harmony.

This seminar aims to explore Patel's role in integrating the princely states, his political philosophy, pragmatism, administrative acumen and his contributions to building a cohesive and strong Indian nation-state. The seminar will feature eminent academicians, historians, political scientists and policymakers who will engage in discussions on Patel's enduring legacy.

Objectives

1. To analyze Sardar Patel's vision of a united India in the wake of Independence and Partition's horror.
2. To examine his role in integrating over 556 princely states into Bharat, constitutionally referred to as the Indian Union.
3. To understand Sardar Patel's contributions to the ideals and policies of equality, justice, fraternity and national integration.
4. To explore his approach to national security, foreign policy, governance and nation-building.
5. To reflect on the relevance of Patel's ideas in contemporary India and their implications for future governance and development.

Guidelines for Submission of Abstract and Full Paper

1. The abstract (500 words) and Poster Intent should be submitted to the google form link: <https://forms.gle/wnKKA4WCE41ARzD8> or send an email to **sardarpatelseminarvit@gmail.com**
2. Once the Abstract is accepted, the word limit of the full-length original paper should be 5000-7000 words.
3. The full paper must accompany an abstract (strictly between 200-300 words) and 4-5 keywords.
4. The full paper should have a title page containing the paper title, name(s) of the author(s), affiliation, e-mail address and mobile no. of the corresponding author.
5. The main document should be double-spaced, with one-inch margins on all sides, and the pages should be numbered consecutively.
6. The paper should follow Times New Roman, 12-point font, line spacing 1.5 and should be submitted in a Word document.
7. The paper should follow the APA (American Psychological Association) 7th edition referencing style.
8. Only submissions in the English language will be considered.
9. All submissions must be the author's original and unpublished work. Plagiarism reports of more than 10% will attract immediate disqualification. Use of generative AI can lead to rejection of the paper.
10. Submissions not adhering to the guidelines will not be considered.
11. Poster must be displayed only in A2 Size Chart paper.

College Students are eligible for Poster Presentation

Scope for Publication

1. ICSSR will publish a few selected papers based on the peer review by an expert peer-review committee.
2. The seminar organiser will also publish the selected papers in Scopus-indexed international publications.
3. Best Paper Awards and Best Poster for College Students Category

3. At least one of the authors needs to present their paper on the day of the event.
